2022 ICSA Annual Conference

The International Chinese Sociological Association (ICSA) is pleased to announce to hold its 5th Annual Conference in Guangzhou from **December 16 to 17, 2022 (Beijing Time)**. The conference will be organized by the **Urban Governance and Design Thrust Area, Society Hub of Hong Kong University of Science and Technology (Guangzhou)**.

The conference's theme is **"Expanding Traditional Boundary of Sociology: New Issues and New Challenges in Uncertain Times."** In the event of the COVID-19 and international travel restriction, the conference will be held in **a mixed mode with both face-to-face and online formats**.

The COVID-19 pandemic has fundamentally changed the way of how we live, how we work, and how we interact with other people, accelerating the transformations of economy, society and politics in the contemporary world. Such transformations present great challenges to sociological research in both substantive topics and methodological approach. In the post-pandemic era with high uncertainties, the discipline should move beyond the traditional boundary, incorporate a more cross disciplinary approach to the new issues and new challenges ahead.

The ICSA program committee welcomes submissions on this theme and related topics, both theoretical work and empirical analysis. Papers offering comparative perspectives and cross-disciplinary approaches are particularly welcome. Both complete papers and extended abstracts in English will be considered. Extended abstracts must contain sufficient details to suggest timely completion (normally, 5 pages or more). Please provide all authors' names, organizational affiliations, and email addresses.

Graduate students are invited to compete for the **ICSA 2022 Nan Lin Graduate Student Paper Award**. One paper (published or unpublished) will be selected and the award will be announced in the conference and presented with a plaque and a check of **USD 500** (by mail).

To be considered for **the Nan Lin Graduate Student Paper Award**, papers must be (1) authored by student(s) only, (2) in English, and (3) to be presented at the 2022 ICSA Annual Conference. Student status must be valid as of the end of 2022. **Only complete papers will be considered.**

Emerging Scholar Spotlight

Yi-Lin Chiang, Dept of Sociology, National Chengchi University

My research focuses on educational stratification and intergenerational status transmission in greater China. I am especially interested in how family background and cultural capital shape children's educational attainment. My first book, *Study Gods: How the New Chinese Elite Prepare for Global Competition*, published by Princeton University Press, examines how elite adolescents achieve by absorbing and implementing the rules surrounding status. Drawing on data from eight-years of ethnography and extensive interviews with 28 socioeconomically elite Chinese teenagers from Beijing, this book reveals the important lessons that Chinese youth learn in their pursuit of elite status around the world. In addition to being an ethnographer, I am fluent in quantitative methods. In other lines of research, I use panel data to examine educational inequality in Taiwan and in China. With an interest in mixed methods, I am an enthusiastic collaborator with colleagues in sociology as well as other fields, such as demography, economics, education, public health, and applied mathematics. My next project is an ethnography that examines the process of elite institutional gatekeeping in Taiwan.

Profile for Students on the Job Market

Chuncheng Liu, Ph.D. candidate, sociology and science studies, the University of California San Diego

Chuncheng Liu is a sociology and science studies PhD candidate at the University of California San Diego. He specializes in political sociology, sociology of science, knowledge, and technology, and economic sociology. He studies how institutions like the state and market classify and quantify people with algorithms and other emerging technologies.

His dissertation project utilizes a 10-month ethnography, more than 100 interviews, two national surveys, and government documents to examine the contested logic and practices of a municipal Chinese social credit system (SCSs). The system employs an algorithm with about 400 behavioral indicators to assign each citizen a trustworthiness score in a northern Chinese city to advance social and moral control of the state. He traces this system across different stages, illustrating how it emerges in the high-level policy debates and is assembled on the ground. He shows that while the system extends the state's vision, its goals, operations, and outcomes are constantly reconfigured and even failed. Partially, this is due to the organizational, institutional, and relational constraints of the street-level bureaucrats who collect the data on the ground. It is also because citizens have agency in challenging the value of the scores and reshaping the meaning of classifications assigned.

Profile for Students on the Job Market

Haoming Song, Ph.D. Candidate, Sociology, Brown University

What are the relationships between family diversity and social inequality? I explore socioeconomic inequalities and health disparities and address how family reproduces or reduces inequalities based on gender, sexuality, race/ethnicity, and social class. I mainly apply quantitative methods including causal inference techniques to analyze census, cross-sectional, and longitudinal data. In ongoing work, I also adopt experimental, computational, and geospatial methods. I situate my research in the context of US and China.

My pre-dissertation work has focused on inequalities among heterosexual families. Sexual minorities are gaining visibility worldwide, but research on sexual minorities remains limited. An understanding of the LGBTQ+ community is particularly important because of pervasive stigma and discrimination. My dissertation, titled “The Social Organization of Family Life among Sexual Minorities”, apply multiple nationally representative data to study the health and well-being of sexual minorities and queer families. Against the backdrop of nationwide Marriage Equality in the U.S., I adopt an intersectional perspective to revisit old sociological inquiries in new same-sex contexts, showcasing diverse life experiences of queer individuals and couples. I argue that sexuality is an underappreciated axis of stratification that intersects with other stratifying axes (e.g., gender, race, and class) to (re)produce inequality.
