Local Public Transportation:

Direction from Pennsylvania Convention Center to ICSA Meeting at University of Pennsylvania (PCPSE Building, 133 S 36th St, Philadelphia, PA 19104)

From Convention Center (1101 Arch St), walk south about 0.1 mile (4 minutes) to the 13th St SEPTA station located at 13th St & Market Street, take the Market-Frankford Line (to the direction of 69th Street Transportation Center), after 3 stops (15th St station, 30th St. station and 34th St. station), get off at the 34th St. station, then walk 6 minutes south to the PCPSE building located at 133 S. 36th St.

Subway fare \$2.50, runs every 12 minutes.



Directions to Philadelphia:

From John F. Kennedy International Airport (JFK): Take AirTrain to Jamaica Station and transfer to Long Island Railroad to New York Penn Station. From there, take Amtrak to William H. Gray III 30th Street Station. (*Slower Amtrak alternative on commuter lines: from New York Penn Station, take New Jersey Transit train to Trenton and then change to SEPTA train to William H. Gray III 30th Street Station*).

From Newark Liberty International Airport (EWR): Take AirTrain to Newark Liberty International Airport Station. From there, take Amtrak to William H. Gray 30th Street Station. (*Slower Amtrak alternative on commuter lines: from Newark Liberty International Airport Station, take New Jersey Transit train to Trenton and then change to SEPTA train to William H. Gray III 30th Street Station*).

From Philadelphia International Airport (PHL): Take SEPTA Airport Line to William H. Gray III 30th Street Station.
